Spring brings music and memorable performances to Washington, D.C.! Pack a picnic to enjoy a show outside or plan a glamorous evening out at the theater. Open air performances are free, but subject to weather conditions.

## Music, Song, and Storytelling on Stage

- <u>USMC Sunset & Evening Parades</u> Ceremonial excellence performed by "The President's Own" USMC Band, "The Commandant's Own" USMC Drum & Bugle Corps, and the esteemed USMC Silent Drill Platoon.
- <u>USA Twilight Tattoo</u> A tradition of precision and discipline performed by The Old Guard and "Pershing's Own," the U.S. Army Band.
- <u>US Navy</u> Full concert and ensemble groups showcase a variety of musical styles including country, rock, and classic hits
- Arena Stage Contemporary Theater "in the round" where you feel like you are a part of the production
- Warner Theater Opened in 1924, with a gold leaf lobby, ceilings, and crystal chandeliers to host Broadway productions, comedy, dance, film, and concerts.
- <u>Ford's Theater</u> Explore Lincoln's legacy through the stage play, "One Destiny," which shares perspectives on the assassination as retold by period actors.
- <u>National Theater</u> Opened in 1835 for the city's political and social elite. Nearby the White House. Enjoy "Beetlejuice - The Musical" in May.
- Kennedy Center Takes "center stage" in DC with a rich variety of music, song, dance, and theater. Free performances at the Millenium Stage.
- <u>Shakespeare Theater</u> "Here There Are Blueberries," a story of the Holocaust told in photos and narrative.
- Constitution Hall (DAR) National Historic Landmark Bulding,
  1929. This May you'll see Tina Fey & Amy Poehler from Saturday
  Night Live, and The Soull II Soul Tour British musical collective.
