A BILL

To amend the Congressional Budget and Impoundment Control Act of 1974 to require the Director of the Congressional Budget Office to provide testimony at annual hearings held by the Committees on the Budget of the House of Representatives and the Senate, and for other purposes.

2 *tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,*

3 **SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.**

4 This Act may be cited as the “CBO Oversight Act”.

1 **SEC. 2. CONGRESSIONAL BUDGET OFFICE ANNUAL HEAR-**
2 **INGS REQUIREMENT.**

3 (a) IN GENERAL.—Title II of the Congressional
4 Budget and Impoundment Control Act of 1974 (2 U.S.C.
5 601 et seq.) is amended by inserting after section 203 the
6 following new section:

7 “CONGRESSIONAL BUDGET OFFICE ANNUAL HEARINGS
8 REQUIREMENT

9 “SEC. 204. During each calendar year, at the request
10 of the chair of the Committee on the Budget of the House
11 of Representatives or the Senate, the Director shall pro-
12 vide testimony at two hearings at each such Committee
13 by the end of the calendar year. Such hearings may ad-
14 dress any issue such Committees deem appropriate, in-
15 cluding reviewing the accuracy of the baseline projections
16 and estimates prepared by the Office during the most re-
17 cently completed fiscal year.”.

18 (b) CLERICAL AMENDMENT.—The table of contents
19 in section 1(b) of such Act is amended by inserting after
20 the item relating to section 203 the following:

“Sec. 204. Congressional Budget Office annual hearings requirement.”.
